SAI in association with the University of Birmingham hosts a day-long joint workshop on 'Applied Sports Science for Performance'

**New Delhi, 13th January 2022:** Sports Authority of India (SAI) in association with the University of Birmingham (UoB), the United Kingdom on Thursday, January 13th, 2022 virtually hosted a day-long joint workshop and symposium on the topic of 'Applied Sports Science for Performance.'

In the Key note address, Mr. Rohit Bharadwaj, Secretary, Sports Authority of India (SAI), reiterated role of Sports Science in promotion of sports excellence, especially in the last few decades. Eminent Sports Experts addressed the audience over the day which covered topics such as - How can applied sports science support elite performance in India, Applied Sports Science in Hockey by Dr (Col) Bibhu Nayak of SAI, Applied Sports Medicine by Dr. S.R. Sarla of SAI, Applied Sports Physiology by Professor Barry Drust from UoB, Applied Sports Psychology by Professor Joan Duda of UoB, and Applied Sports Nutrition by Dr. Gareth Wallis of UoB.

The multiple addresses covered the topic of intervention of the topic of Sports Science in Indian sports and what is the outcome of these interventions. The lectures were followed by questions and answer session which was very invigorating diligently moderated by none other than an ace journalist Sri Vijay Lokpally.

The workshop was telecasted live on SAI and University of Birmingham's Facebook pages with SAI representatives from all over the country being part of the virtual sessions. This opportune symposium was attended by all scientific faculty and personnel, High Performance Managers, Chief Coaches, Head Coaches and National Camp Coaches besides Sports Administrators and head of Divisions.
