At the very outset, the Director General, SAI welcomed the Chairman and the Members of the Governing Body. This was the first meeting, which was being held after its reconstitution. The Chairman, Governing Body in his opening remarks extended a very warm welcome to all the Members and requested for their valuable contribution. # Agenda Item No. 1: Budgetary Requirement for 23 National Centres of Excellence (NCOE) for the Financial Year 2020-21

After detailed deliberations, the Committee decided the following:

- (i) A lumpsum amount of Rs. 2.50 lakhs and Rs. 1.50 lakhs per athlete per year for residential and non-residential respectively keeping in view the past actual expenditure incurred and present prices.
- (ii) The actual amount would depend upon number of athletes.
- (iii) The above amount would include mess, food & nutrition, sports kit, competitions & exposure visits and education related expenditure.
- (iv) SAI would continue to provide requisite lodging, coaches, sports infrastructure and equipments other than personal kit out of its routine budget.
- (v) The funds to be released to SAI as an advance on quarterly basis based on number of athletes in the previous quarter.

# Agenda Item No. 2: Budgetary Requirement for 67 SAI Training Centres for the Financial Year 2020-21

After detailed deliberations the Committee decided to fix a lumpsum amount of Rs.1.50 lakhs and Rs. 1.00 lakh per year per athlete residential and non-residential respectively. The remaining conditions of National Centres of Excellence as above would apply.

# Agenda Item No. 3: Proposal to provide budgetary support for 28 Army/Navy/Air force Boys Sports Company for the Financial Year 2020-21 under Khelo India scheme

The Committee approved annual budget of Rs. 21.03 crores (approx.) for F.Y. 2020-21 with respect to 1402 trainees in 28 Army / Navy / Airforce Boys Sports Company at an average annual expenditure of Rs. 1.5 lakhs per annum per residential athlete. The Committee noted that the above mentioned annual average expenditure is inclusive of expenses on coaching staff. The norms for hiring of coaches and support personnel shall be as under:

- a) 8 coaches per 200 athletes;
- b) 2 physical trainers per 200 athletes;
- c) Masseurs, psychologists, nutritionists, etc. on part time/visiting basis per 200 athletes; and









d) 3 ground men and multi-task man per 200 athletes.

The Committee decided the ceiling of Rs. 1.50 Lakhs per residential trainee has been considered for providing budget and DG (SAI) will have the flexibility of utilising the amount as per the requirement. The above-mentioned budgetary support shall be given in the form of Quarterly grants.

Agenda Item No. 4 & 5: Proposal to provide budgetary support for 90 SAI extension centres for the Financial Year 2020-21 under Khelo India scheme and Proposal to provide budgetary support for 68 schools / Akharas / centres under National Talent Search Contest (NSTC) scheme for the Financial Year 2020-21 under Khelo India scheme

The Agenda Item was deferred.

# Agenda Item No. 6. Procurement of Sports equipment for NCOE and Khelo India Athletes

The Committee desired that requirement may be reassessed in consultation with the experts of respective National Sports Federations (NSFs), other experts, etc. along with the concerned Centre In-charge and the same may be placed before the Committee after the reassessment.

Till such time, the agenda item is deferred.

#### Agenda Item No. 7. Engagement of Human Resource

#### (a) Nutritionists, Asst. Nutritionist, Chefs, Assistant Chefs & Manager:

The Committee while appreciating the fixed cost of hiring of Nutritionists, Asst. Nutritionists, Chefs, Assistant Chefs & Managers for running the mess, noted that SAI has been given the grant from Khelo India which is inclusive of the above-mentioned expenditure as minutized in Agenda Item No. 1.

## (b) Sports Scientists, Sports Medicine and Paramedical Staff

The Committee decided that the process of hiring may be continued as the same has been proposed as a part of the cadre-review under consideration.

Further, it was decided that in case hiring process is completed before completing cadre review, the same may be brought before the Committee for further consideration.

Agenda Item No. 8. Setting up of Centre for Indigenous Games at Amravati, Maharashtra - Adoption of Shree Hanuman VyayamPrasarak Mandal (HVPM) school as small level Khelo India Centre for Mallakhambh& Thang-ta disciplines under State Level Khelo India Centre (SLKIC) vertical under Khelo India Scheme of MYAS)

This Agenda item will be considered in the next meeting.







# Agenda Item No. 9. Engagement of Project Management Unit (PMU) for National Sports Repository System (NSRS)/IT Applications.

The Committee took a note of evolving nature of NSRS/IT applications and thereby approved setting up of PMU at a total estimated cost of Rs. 2.30 Cr for two years which may go upto Rs. 4.0 Crores. Further the Committee authorized DG, SAI to engage more manpower from the PMU as per the need subject to overall ceiling of Rs. 4.00 Crore over a period of two years.

# Agenda Item No. 10. Ratification of payment to SpiceJet Airlines as Travel Partner of KIYG 2020

The Committee ratified the payments amounting to Rs. 73,70,000/- made to M/s SpiceJet Limited for providing dedicated chartered services as the Official Airline Partner for Khelo India Youth Games 2020.

# Agenda Item No. 11. Release of funds to Sports Authority of India (SAI) for different components of Khelo India as well as Fit India Campaign out of funds provided for Technical Support and Capacity Building Services (TSCBS) under Khelo India Scheme – Ratification

The Committee ratified Rs. 10 crores released from the component 'Technical Support and Capacity Building' (TSCB) to SAI. Further DG, SAI has been authorized to incur expenditure from this budget as per the requirement.

# Agenda No. 12. Proposal for hosting U-21 Khelo India Women Hockey League from Hockey India under Khelo India Scheme

The Committee approved the grant of Rs. 32,80,000/- (Rupees Thirty Two Lakhs Eighty Thousand Only) for the proposal submitted by Hockey India for the conduct of Under-21 Khelo India Women Hockey League with the following directions:

- a) A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to be signed between SAI and Hockey India;
- b) Funds to be released to Hockey India as grant linked to number of events organized so that grant to Hockey India is approved on per event basis for settlement of accounts; and
- c) The number of events could be more than those estimated and therefore, DG SAI is authorized to allow expenditure beyond the sanctioned amount up to 10%.

#### CIRCULAR

The Governing Body, SAI in its 53<sup>rd</sup> meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> October, 2020 has approved that the athletes of NCoEs and STCs on resuming their training as per the approved resumption plan will be provided air ticket by SAI from the nearest airport from their home town to the NCoE. Those living in 500 kilometers radius may be provided AC 3 tier train tickets.

The Governing Body also approved the proposal for providing accommodation to coaches and support staff of the NCoEs/STCs. Accordingly, all the support staff (regular and Contractual) who will be part of the training, upkeep of hostel and running of the mess will be provided accommodation with the athletes free of cost. However, nominal charges for boarding @ Rs.50/- per person per day will be charged. These arrangements will be applicable till March 31, 2021.

These arrangements have been approved in order to create a Bio-buble in the training centres and will be applicable till March 31, 2021 in view of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Minutes of the Meeting of the committee constituted for evaluation of proposals received from Corporate houses/Organizations for running the SAI NCOEs/STCs in partnership held under the Chairmanship of DG, SAI.

The Committee met on 18<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 at 12.30 p.m. through video conferencing and the following were present:

The committee was appraised that two proposals were received one from Glenmark Aquatic Foundation (GAF), public trust registered under the Maharastra public trust Act 1950, for NCOE, SPMSPC New Delhi and other from Inspire Institute of Sports (IIS), registered trust under Bombay Public Trust Act 1950 for STC Hisar, Haryana, against SAI's Invitation of expression of interest No.1006/47/SAI/OPS/CSR/2020-21dated 24<sup>th</sup> Dec 2020

## The committee noted the following:

- A) With regard to the proposal received from Glenmark Aquatic Foundation (GAF) for NCOE, SPMSPC New Delhi, the committee desired to have a detailed presentation from GAF on the performance of athletes during last 5 years period.
- B) With regards to the proposal received from Inspire Institute of Sports (IIS) for STC Hisar, the committee found that the proposal is not elaborative on roles and responsibilities between SAI/ IIS and key result area (KRAs).

In view of the above, committee decided that,(a) GAF may give presentation on performance of the athletes during last 5 years of association; (b) IIS may give detailed presentation on their proposal.

The committee further met on 20<sup>th</sup> January 2021 at 11.00 a.m. However, one member, Sh. Sunil Garg, Director MYAS could not attend the meeting owing to official visit to Leh.

During the meeting, detailed presentations were made by GAF and IIS.

## **Observations:**

# 1. Proposal from M/s Glenmark Aquatic Foundation (GAF):

a. Since, SAI already had 5 years association with M/s GAF upto 20<sup>th</sup> December 2020, which has further been extended up to March 2021, the committee reviewed the performance of athletes of the NCOE, SPMSPC and contribution of M/s GAF during the last 5 years. In the ongoing contract, the key responsibilities of GAF are Talent Identification, Talent nurturing-



recruitment & compensation for coaching and staff, athlete scholarship, advance foreign training & competition etc. On these components, an amount of Rs. 1.90 Cr per year was committed by GAF. Details of spends by GAF during the period of 5 years is placed at **Annexure A**. The committee noted that an amount of approx. Rs. 40 lakhs is still remaining unspent. The representative of the GAF agreed to carry forward unspent amount.

#### b. Performance of swimmers:

During the last 5 years the academy swimmer's performance has improved at national and international levels. Based on the improved present timing in the competition some talented swimmers are medal prospects in upcoming Asian Games. Four athletes of the academy have best performance in India and holding national records. One athlete namely Kushagra Rawat has done remarkably well and is the only Indian swimmer to achieve 3 B cut timings for Olympics 2021. Sheet containing detail information on past performance of the swimmers is placed at **Annexure B.** 

#### c. Key Result Areas for the contract:

GAF has proposed that with joint efforts with SAI and under guidance of expert coaches swimmers will be able to achieve performance targets set for them. The performance targets set by the GAF which includes targets for 2024 and 2028 are placed at **Annexure C.** 

#### 2. Inspire Institute of Sports:

a. A steering committee consisting of 3 members from SAI and IIS each for the purpose performance goal setting, define KPIs on a yearly basis, fund Utilization, finalise proposed org structure etc.

#### b. Financial commitment:

The institute will spend Rs. 1.5cr per annum to include the expenditure on Manpower, Physio consumables, Technical equipment/apparel, Travel etc. However, the details regarding financial spent was not available in the proposal.

- 2. With regard to proposal for STC Hisar, the proposal submitted by IIS was incomplete. IIS was advised to submit a detailed proposal on roles and responsibilities and financial commitments. On receipt, the proposal will be submitted for approval after examination by the Committee.
